

# Adiantum caudatum L.

It is often used as ornamental plant for indoor gardening, particularly in terrariums and hanging baskets. Its fronds are pinnate, with multiple pairs of small, fan-shaped leaflets that are typically bright green. These leaflets are arranged in a feathery, symmetrical pattern. This fern is known for its creeping or "walking" habit. It propagates by producing small plantlets at the tips of its fronds, which can root and grow into new plants, giving it the appearance of "walking". It requires indirect light, high humidity, and consistently moist but not waterlogged soil to thrive. It is often found in moist, shaded areas like the forest floor, near streams, or in humid environments.
