Pteris ensiformis Burm.f.

A perennial evergreen fern. It has striking fronds that are pinnately compound. The individual leaflets of Pteris ensiformis are elongated, lance-shaped, and finely divided, giving them a delicate and lace-like appearance. Rhizomes are often brown and produce new fronds as they grow. This fern is native to tropical and subtropical regions and is often found in moist, shaded environments. It prefers well-draining, humus-rich soil. The sori, are usually arranged in rows along the margins of the leaflets and are often covered by an indusium.
