Adiantum peruvianum Klotzsch.

This fern is known for its delicate and graceful appearance. It has fronds that are finely divided and fan-shaped, creating a lacy and feathery appearance. Each frond is made up of numerous small leaflets or pinnae, which are attached to a slender, wiry rachis. The fronds can reach lengths of up to 60 centimeters (24 inches). The foliage of Adiantum peruvianum is characterized by its fine and delicate texture, which gives it a light and airy quality. The leaflets are often a bright green color. This fern is native to South America, particularly the Andean region, and can be found in moist, shady environments such as forested areas, along stream banks, or in humid cloud forests. It reproduces by spores produced on the undersides of the fronds.
